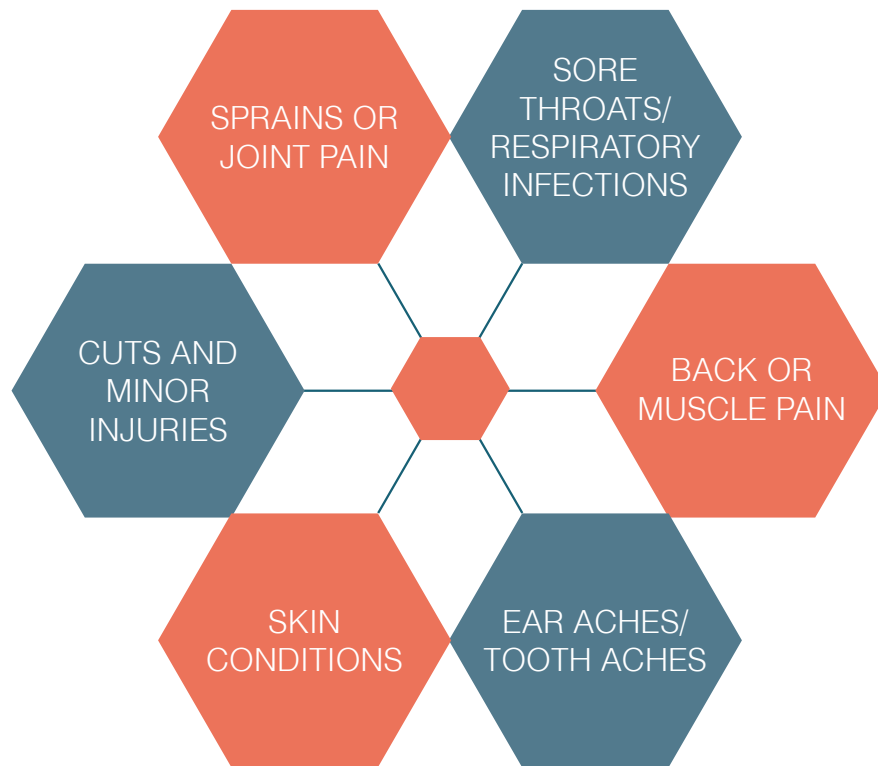

MEDICARE ANNUAL WELLNESS VISITS

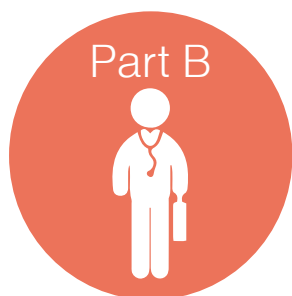

The focus of this visit is to promote a specific preventative based discussion between the patient and their primary care provider. Medicare Wellness Visits are a free and important piece of primary care services. Preventive care has saved lives, improved quality of life and promoted early detection of diseases.

A Medicare Wellness Visit at West Park Hospital involves a detailed discussion with a health care professional about your health and wellness along with reviewing past medical issues. Patients will learn about mammograms, colonoscopies, lab results, immunizations, and a variety of free screenings all designed to empower them to be an active participant in their healthcare decisions in collaboration with their primary care physician.

The additional space will allow staff to work more efficiently to better care for our patients. Front desk services will now be in one location for both Radiation and Medical Oncology patients, making it more convenient to receive care.

COMMUNITY EMS PROGRAM UPDATE

WHAT IS THE COMMUNITY EMS PROGRAM?


Healthcare needs far outnumber the healthcare options in Wyoming and the United States. Residents must travel great distances to receive even the most basic care.

The Community Emergency Medical Services (EMS) program is an emerging healthcare profession that will help close the gap by expanding the role of EMS personnel. It allows paramedics and emergency medical technicians to provide routine healthcare services to underserved populations, and helps to improve rural emergency medical services. Some rural patients lack access to primary care, and use 911 services for non-urgent healthcare. The program will help meet the needs of rural residents in a more efficient and proactive way.

Cody Regional Health was approved in November of 2017 to be the first clinician level community EMS program in the state of Wyoming. The program is going into effect in early 2018.

The program allows Cody Regional Health EMS staff to make in-home visits to patients who are at risk for readmission or don't qualify for home health services. Physicians can also order Cody Regional Health EMS staff to go in and conduct in-home evaluations for the patient.
